8. President's Report – SportCheer Scotland President Lisa Tausney

a. Overview of the SportCheer Scotland Objectives

- Manage, direct, promote, organise and assist the activities and disciplines associated with Cheerleading in Scotland
- Encourage the growth and development of Cheer Programs and opportunities to Scottish youth

- Provide SCS members; Scotland's coaches, teachers, and educators, with tools for researching trends, technology, ideas, issues and solutions to problems associated with Cheerleading
- Propose and support bids for international competitions in Scotland

b. Review of the Past 12 Months

- SportCheer Scotland was established in August 2018
- First AGM was held on Wednesday, August 1st as per the ICU statutes of governance
- Held the first ICU coach credentialing on Sunday, August 19th. LT expressed appreciation to Gemma Butterly and Stacy Greer for organising the session
- Negotiated with the European Cheer Union and was awarded full membership on 27th June
- Launched the SportCheer Scotland website
- Attended the ICU Annual Conference and represented Scotland at the ICU Annual General Meeting as the United Kingdom alongside a delegate from England. Attended seminars for Anti-Doping, National Federation Development, Special Olympics, and Adaptive Abilities.
- Awarded the ICU Breakthrough Award for 2018/19. To be recognised for the massive progress we have made as a national federation by the ICU and other member federations was a special achievement and one of the proudest moments of 2019.

c. Team Scotland Report

- Team Scotland is one the largest responsibilities of SportCheer Scotland
- Seven teams and two duets represented Scotland at the 2019 ICU World Championships
- In 2019 the greatest number of Scottish teams and athletes in history competed as Team Scotland

- To concentrate on the continued growth of SportCheer Scotland as an inclusive national federation focussing on what is best for the athletes and our sport.

9. Secretary's Report – SportCheer Scotland Secretary Victoria Bichener

a. Progress of SportCheer Scotland

- Recognised by the International Cheer Union as Scotland's National Federation
- Lisa Tausney, Jennifer Boyle and Victoria Bichener represented SportCheer Scotland at the 2019 ICU Conference and Annual General Meeting
- SportCheer Scotland has been registered with Companies House as "Cheer Scotland;" a Private Company Limited by Guarantee. This registration denotes SportCheer Scotland as not-for-profit
- SportCheer Scotland awarded full membership to the European Cheer Union as Scotland's National Federation

b. Objectives to further growth of SportCheer Scotland

1. Launch the SportCheer Scotland membership scheme

- Proposed benefits to members include:
 - The opportunity to try out for national teams
 - Access to members' only instructional and/or educational videos
 - Promotion through SportCheer Scotland social media platforms
- The scheme will provide much needed income for SportCheer Scotland
- A record of the number and distribution of the athletes participating in Scottish Cheerleading is required by the International Olympic Committee and SportScotland. It is crucial that we begin to collate this information to further the opportunities for Scottish athletes and coaches.

2. Secure the Recognition of Sport Scotland

- In August 2020 SportCheer Scotland will have concluded its first two years as cheerleading's governing body and will be eligible to seek recognition from SportScotland
- A substantial benefit to recognition will be the access to potential funding for clubs. Most funding programmes list recognition as the first criterion for applicants.

10. Treasurer's Report – SportCheer Scotland Treasurer Sarah McNeill

- SM presented the financial report from 2018-2019
- SCS will be required to file accounts with Companies House in January 2021.

11. Reports of Standing Committees – SportCheer Scotland Vice President Jennifer Boyle

a. National Team Committee.

- Supported the administrative and financial management of Team Scotland 2018-2019
- This was the first year in which fully-unified National Teams represented Scotland at the ICU World Championships and the largest number of Scottish athletes attended in the competition's history.

-National Team coaches, athletes, parents and carers were surveyed at the end of the season for feedback. Recognised as areas for improvement were:

- Management workload
- Communication

-Management structure expanded to include Team Co-Ordinators and a designated Team Scotland Treasurer.

-A monthly newsletter will be sent to each athlete regarding training/upcoming deadlines/trip information/kit orders to improve communication.

b. Ethics Committee.

- Appointed Elizabeth Jolly as the SportCheer Scotland Child Protection Officer.
- Drafted the following SportCheer Scotland policies:
 - Child Protection
 - Equality and Diversity
 - Voluntary
 - Safeguarding
 - Privacy

c. Training and Coach Education

- Delivered ICU Cheerleading and Performance Cheer credentialing course at Centre 81, Clydebank on Sunday, August 19th 2018.

12. Modification of Statutes

-Two changes to the SportCheer Scotland Statutes were proposed:

1. References to the Cheerleading UK governing body be updated from SCGB to SCUUK
2. The registered address of SportCheer Scotland to be updated to Centre81, Clydebank.

-Victoria Bichener proposed a vote on this modification, seconded by Jennifer Boyle.

-The modifications were accepted by the meeting.
